### Legislation: Open Meetings Act changes proposed to allow for virtual meetings

HB 6207 (2020) would amend the Open Meetings Act, [Amend sec. 3 of 1976 PA 267 (MCL 15.263) & adds sec. 3a] to allow for meetings to be held electronically by telephonic or video conferencing in compliance with the Act. An electronic meeting would require 2-way communication so that members of the public body and members of the public can hear and be heard. "A physical place is not required for an electronic meeting, and members of a public body and members of the public participating electronically in a meeting that is held in a physical place are to be considered present and in attendance at the meeting for all purposes (3.a (3)" Local units of government with an internet presence are subject to several requirements, including making the agenda of the electronic meeting available on a website at least 2 hours before the meeting begins." The bill was introduced on 9/15/20 and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

# Legislation: Sand and gravel mining, proposed zoning preemption moves forward

<u>SB 431</u> would amend the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act [Amends sec. 205 of 2006 PA 110 (MCL <u>125.3205</u>)] to: "Prohibit a local unit of government from preventing, prohibiting, or denying a permit, approval, or other authorization for the mining of natural resources if the natural resources were valuable and very serious consequences would not result from the extraction of the natural resources. Provide that a person who sought to extract natural resources by mining could meet the requirements above by submitting to a local unit of government a plan for the proposed extraction that met certain requirements. Provide that, if an applicant had made a prima facie case that the requirements were met, the burden of proof would shift to the party challenging or opposing the proposed mining activity. Describe certain limitations on a local unit of government's regulation of a mining operation. Specify that a permit or other authorization issued by a local unit of government to extract natural resources by mining would be valid until mining operations, including reclamation, were completed." Source: Senate Fiscal Agency Bill Analysis SB 431 and 849 (6-24-20).

The bill was approved by the Committee on Natural Resources (on 9/23/20) and referred to committee of the whole with substitute (S-6). This legislation is TIE BAR with <u>SB 0849 (2020)</u> Amends sec. 32723 of 1994 PA 451 (MCL 324.32723) adds sec. 1708. The <u>Michigan Townships Association</u>, and <u>Michigan Municipal League</u> oppose this bill.
